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
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# HOME BUILDERS



If the home had a star of the show, it was no doubt the kitchen—and people couldn't stop talking about it. It's beautiful, yes, but also inviting and incredibly usable.







We are excited to unveil these improvements to the show. We need all members to support the show by exhibiting or attending. It's been a pleasure to make positive changes to the show and I appreciate the entire home show committee for their time working on the show since last March.


